### Stumped!

**Question:** I'm recertifying a Tree Farm, initially certified in 2007. While currently recorded as one tree farm, it actually consists of 3 separate contiguous parcels. One parcel is 10 acres with 6 acres forested. The other two are 40 and 280 forested acres. Do I have to decertify this 6 acre parcel?

**Answer:** Great question! Since this 6 acre parcel was initially certified before 12/31/2009 it can continue to be certified if it meets the standard. No Tree Farms less than 10 acres can be certified past 1/1/2010. As there are now three Tree Farms (according to the definition of contiguous), please ensure they are represented this way on the 004 forms and in the database. This helps improve the accuracy of our database and gives verifiers a better target for confirming certification.
