The ATFS Addendum is an important tool for our certified Tree Farmers. It will help them review their management plans, reflect on their stewardship objectives, assess the current condition and health of their woods and ensure that their management plan meets the 2015-2020 Standards. The addendum is currently available in three formats:

- 1. To print a hard copy and fill out by hand.
- 2. As a fillable pdf that can be completed online and saved as a digital file.
- 3. As a tool on MyLandPlan.org that allows landowners to easily update their addendum over time as well as download a pdf version to share.

Mylandplan.org is an online resource for woodland owners. The site includes valuable content to help landowners create wildlife habitat, protect the water on their land, maintain the health of their woods and addressing the topics of the Standards of Sustainability. The tools on the site allow landowners to easily map their land, set their goals, record the history of their land and track their activities. This tool is particularly valuable to Tree Farmers and can address past assessment issues around maps, archiving their management plan and documenting their activities.

Your Legacy, Your Land

As part of the 75th anniversary of ATFS, we partnered with Oregon State University to develop the Your Legacy, Your Land program. This program broke the legacy planning process into easy steps that landowners can begin to work on. Resources are available online including, videos with experts, tips and worksheets. The legacy planning steps are:

- 1. Make a commitment to your legacy
- 2. Create an overview of your estate
- 3. Set goals for your legacy and your land
- 4. Outline who does what on your land and plan for who will do it in the future
- 5. Gather your documents
- 6. Identify and communicate with your heirs
- 7. Plan and host a family meeting
- 8. Review different ownership and estate options
- 9. Find an estate planning attorney
- 10. Consider a conservation easement
- 11. Develop your plan
- 12. Execute your plan
