Between Days 2 and 3 Inventory your property. You will be supplied with equipment necessary to perform a stewardship inventory on your property. This can be accomplished in the evenings after work for smaller properties (<20 ac.), or may take a couple days for larger properties.

Day 3 Indoor class 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.

On-site Consultation Following the Workshop - As Scheduled

After you complete your plan, a Certified Stewardship Advisor will visit you, at no additional cost, at your forest for about 2-6 hours. This is a great opportunity to consult with a resource professional about your objectives, your forest, and your Forest Stewardship Plan. For reporting purposes, you are asked to submit a copy of your plan to MSU Extension Forestry.

Workshop Registration Fee \$150 per Ownership Includes one set of course materials and a site visit to your property. Additional family members and/or partners representing the ownership are encouraged to attend at no additional cost. Duplicate sets of workshop manuals are available at cost (\$110). Registration fees are not refundable after the application deadline but can be applied toward a future workshop.
